A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) is the leading genetic killer of children under the age of two. SMA is known to cause degeneration in voluntary muscle movement for those that survive with the disease. One in 40 Americans carry this gene; and

WHEREAS, Spinal Muscular Atrophy crosses all racial, ethnic and religious boundaries, and can strike anyone of any age, race or gender; and

WHEREAS, increased awareness of Spinal Muscular Atrophy will lead to increased knowledge and increased support for both disease research and the families affected by the disease, hopefully leading to a cure; and

WHEREAS, in order to raise awareness and help promote research into this devastating disease, Patient Groups have named August as National Spinal Muscular Atrophy Awareness Month.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, hereby proclaim August 2010, as

SPINAL MUSCULAR ATROPHY AWARENESS MONTH

in the State of Mississippi.
